

### Classes begin Tuesday, August 23, 2022

Classes begin each day at 8:00 a.m. and release at 3:10 p.m.

Nichols classes begin Monday, August 22, 2022. Nichols students will be required to attend Nichols classes.

The Department of Health requires all immunizations be up-to-date before a child attends school. If immunizations are not current, an "in progress" card from the physician must be submitted to the school nurse prior to August 23. Please submit updated immunization records prior to August 23. The State of Missouri requires all Seniors and 8<sup>th</sup> grade students receive a meningococcal (Menactra) vaccine, and all 8<sup>th</sup> grade students receive a T-dap immunization. If your child has already received either vaccination, please submit documentation to Fatima prior to August 23. If your child has not received either vaccination, or if you are unsure of your child's immunization status, please contact Fatima at 573-455-2375 ext. 181 or 182.

K-12 students who reside within the Fatima school district who did not attend Fatima last year and have not yet registered for this year should report to Fatima any day Wed Aug 3 thru Fri Aug 5 between 8:00 AM - 2:00 PM to register.

**GENERAL INFORMATION:** The first day of school (Tues, Aug 23) breakfast and lunch will be served. A deposit should be made into lunch accounts prior to the start of school. Picture Day for K-12 is Wednesday, Sept 7 (senior photos will be taken for the class composite). All students must have a photo taken for school lunch ID's. Retake day for K-12 will be Thurs, Oct 20. Parking spaces will be assigned to all drivers and parking tags will be issued to new drivers during Registration Day.

HS REGISTRATION DAY: Freshman Orientation will be Tues, Aug 9, 6:00-7:00 pm. Fatima will be open to all JH and HS students/families 4pm-7pm Thurs, Aug 18 for Registration Day. *All 7th-12<sup>th</sup> grade students and a parent/guardian must attend* as there is information students and parents are required to complete prior to the student being issued a Chromebook. *Chromebooks will be issued during Registration Day (there is a \$15 non-refundable deposit)*. The Student Handbook is available on-line at <a href="www.fatimacomets.org">www.fatimacomets.org</a>. You are strongly encouraged to read it in its entirety prior to Registration Day. A registration link will be available from Aug 8-17 at <a href="www.fatimacomets.org">www.fatimacomets.org</a> for those who would like to complete the digital portion of registration prior to Aug 18.

**ELEMENTARY OPEN HOUSE:** Open House will be Thurs, Aug 18, 5:00-7:00 PM. Prior to Open House, ALL parents will be required to go to a registration link on the website (<a href="www.fatimacomets.org">www.fatimacomets.org</a>) to complete forms digitally. Once inside this link, you will need to go to the Elementary section to complete the documents. This link will be open from August 8 through August 17. This is being done digitally prior to open house in an effort to minimize the paperwork required for registration.

**SCHOOL BREAKFAST / LUNCH PROGRAM:** Aug 23 is a full day of school and breakfast/lunch will be served. Applications for free/reduced school meals will be issued at Registration Day and Open House. If your child qualifies for F/R meals, please know that you are responsible for all charges incurred prior to your application being approved. It is **strongly** recommended that applications for F/R Meals are returned to school PRIOR to Aug 23. It is also strongly recommended that all families complete and return this form as all qualifying students and the school greatly benefit from this program. All forms are processed with strict confidentiality.

**ACTIVITY FEE and PHYSICALS:** Students will be assessed a \$20 PER ACTIVITY fee to participate in clubs/sports (\$100 family cap). All students participating in a school sponsored BAND or SPORTS ACTIVITY must have an active Privit account and completed physical <u>prior</u> to the start of practice. Physical forms can be obtained in the HS office. All students participating in a school activity must be in the drug testing pool or they are ineligible to participate in the activity. **Physicals are now valid for 2 years from the date of the physical.**

# The latest from State Technical College ...

State Technical College

State Tech has experienced massive amounts of growth over the past few years. In fact, we have broken a new record each of the last five years with our number of firstyear students to campus! The Chronicles of Higher Education recently named us the "fastest growing college in the state."

At State Tech, when we say we are the #1 college in the country, we also have the trophies to back it up.

How many two-year colleges can say their recent graduates wear a World Series ring (Red Sox 2018), a Super Bowl ring (Chiefs 2020) and are working major PGA tour events? State Tech can, and that's in our Commercial Turfand Grounds program alone.

There are a variety of other reasons for the growth. For example, did you know that State Tech has a 99% job placement rate? Meaning if you come to State Tech, you will get a job. We also have the second highest graduation rate in the entire country.

Not only that, but 10 years into their career, a State Tech graduate will have on average a higher salary than graduates from most regional four-year universities. Those are just some of the reasons why State Tech has seen numerous #1 in the country rankings over the last few years from the likes of WalletHub, Zippia, Stacker and University HQ.

This massive enrollment growth does present new challenges, like needing more instruction space and a review of the student-to-teacher ratios within some departments. Taking this into consideration, State Tech decided to start building!

Over the past few years, State Tech has moved our health science programs to the main campus, located in a brand new Health Science Center. We also added the Civil Technology Center and the Utility Technology Center, to transform the back end of our campus. Most recently, we also took ownership of the Osage Country Club.

The Osage Country Club will add a 30,000 square foot entertainment and event center. Within the building, there will be a pro-shop, e-sports space, 50 seat "AMC Style" theater, sports bar and restaurant, four lanes of Duckpin Social bowling, and three golf simulators. Upstairs will be a 300-seat event center with full glass views of the golf course and water

Outside the clubhouse building, Columbia Pool and Spa will begin construction on a zero entry pool. A large patio will include fire pits and a variety of outdoor games and entertainment. Next door to the clubhouse is another exciting building project! This new building will be home to State Tech's Commercial Turfand Grounds Management academic program.

Attached to the back of the building is a driving range that will utilize Top Range technology. State Tech is also in the process of building an 18-hole disc golf course at the country club that should be considered a "Top 100" course when complete.

After five straight years of record enrollment, this new facility will bring something unique to Central Missouri, and will become a destination that will attract students from all across the state

"We will have something for everyone. Whether it is hosting corporate retreats, weddings, or giving students and the community something to do, it does not get much more comprehensive than what we are about to do in Linn. Ultimately, this will help us continue to grow our student population and Missouri's skilled workforce," said State Tech President Dr. Shawn Strong.

This project is made possible thanks in part to the State Tech's Student Government

Association. The council recently passed a \$5 addition to the original \$10-per-credit-hour recreational fee. This fee allows students to golf and swim for free.

Erin Clark, Student Government Association Intramural Coordinator, commented "We believe we had to pass this for our future students, to continue to add things for them to do in Linn."

There are a variety of new programs offered at State Tech as well. In just the past few years, we have added Digital Marketing, Agribusiness, Civil Construction, Energy Technology and our Associate of Science in Business transfer degree.

State Tech is home to more than 50 labs across campus. Including our precision machining lab, the Lincoln electric welding center, our auto collision paint booths, an aviation hangar, automotive service bays, health science labs, the Osage Country Club, an indoor climbing lab with outdoor boring labs and even 40+ acres dedicated to our heavy equipment operations program.

State Tech is also proud of our unique partner programs, like the Caterpillar Think Big program, as well as our MFA option.
